The undersigned, Clerk of the Circuit Court, within and for the County of
Handricks, in the State of Indiana, respectfully reports to said
Court, that in the vacation thereof, to-wit: on the 19th day of August
1887, an instrument of writing, purporting to be the last Will and Testament of
William Woodard, deceased, late of said County and
State, was presented to said Clerk for Probate and Record. That thereupon, on said
date, appeared before said Clerk, Joshua M Cook

who, being duly sworn, on oath averred that he is a subscribing witness to said
