At the time of Contracting the
the above Debt of \$7.50. James Woods undertook to discharge
it in sawing plank, with the Whip saw, at the rate of
62½ Cents per Hundred feet, finding a hand to saw
with him & to board him while at work for me. he
afterwards came & sawed some for me, but as I never
measured the plank, I cannot say how much he sawed.

When I last saw him, he was about moving to Hendricks
County, and told me, he had kept an account of what
he had sawed, & thought it was near eight Hundred
feet. He was to come on in a short time and saw
the ballance, but he never came. If he sawed 800 ft
they would amount to ~~50~~ dollars, leaving a balance
my favor of \$2.50 due on the acct.
