

Transcription of a sample discharge and oath of identity (from Miscellaneous Record Book 2, page 47):

Discharge of John David Hall:

To All Whom it May Concern—Know ye that John David Hall a private of Captain B. A. F. Greer's Company (B) Twentieth Regiment of O. V. D. who was enrolled on the eighteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and sixty one to serve three years is hereby discharged from the Service of the United States this twenty-fifth day of October 1862 at Bolivar, Tennessee by reason of Surgeon Certificate of disability. Said John David Hall was born in Shelby county in the State of Ohio is twenty-one years of age, five feet ten inches high, dark complexion, black eyes, black hair and by occupation when enrolled, a farmer. Given at Bolivar, Tenn. this twenty-fifth day of October 1862. M. F. Force, Col. Comdg

Oath of Identity of John David Hall:

State of Indiana; County of DeKalb on this third day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six personally appeared before me the undersigned Notary Public for the county and state above mentioned, John David Hall, who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the Identical Person who was a private in the company commanded by Captain B. A. F. Greer in the Regiment 20th Ohio V Inft commanded by M. F. Force that he enlisted on the 28 day of January for the term of three years and was discharged at Bolivar Tenn. on twenty-fifth day of October 1862 by reason of Surgeon's Certificate of Disability.
