long as she shall remain my widow, and if she should marry then she  
is to be debarred from all but her third of my estate and until then  
I do make her my sole administratrix over all my estate that I hold in the  
world, and whereas I hold one half quarter of land in this state which is  
not paid out of the office, it is my desire that she should appropriate  
so much of my money to that use as to obtain a patent from the  
United States for the same, and in order that this my last will may be of  
record I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of May  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four

having full possession of all my mental powers but weak in body and viewing the uncertainty of human life have made and published this my last Will and Testament and by these presents do make ordain publish and declare this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments heretofore made by me.

I appoint my affectionate wife Mrs B Allen Executrix of my last Will and Testament to use as she may deem necessary, all my personal estate, purchasing such things from time to time as she may deem necessary or proper for her comfort or convenience or to give and bequeath during her natural life, or after her decease all or any portion of my estate, commending to her care my dear Sister Hannah Spooner as among the fit objects of charity.

I also give my Executrix full and complete power to dispose of all my Real Estate in such a manner as I myself could or might do were I present at the day of the same and have as full and complete power as any Executor can have for selling, reinvesting or converting to her own use and benefit.

In case of my wife's death before that of my own in such case she being dead I appoint as Executors my Friends Dr Burr Bradley Physician of Salem Indiana Dr William H Scribner Physician of Peoria Indiana Frederick B Leonard Student of medicine of Lansingburgh New York John B Chipman Merchant of Lansingburgh New York and Dr Chas Sheldon Physician and Goshen Book Druggist of Troy New York Thilander Chase Bishop of the Diocese of Ohio to have full and complete power to make sale reinvest or dispose of or in any way or manner as I myself would do were I present at the day of the same.

I give and bequeath to the three sons of my deceased brother John Allen & to the five sons of my sister Hannah Spooner, all my right & title to that fraction of land on White River Indiana, commonly known as the Pride Settlement fraction, or fractional section N<sup>o</sup> 20 section in Town N<sup>o</sup> one north, of Range six west, to be divided equally between them to share & share alike.

I give & bequeath all the remaining parts or part of my estate which I may be in possession of at the time of my decease, and all that may hereafter fall to me by will from my wife, from the estate of Timothy Leonard dec<sup>d</sup>. to the American Tract Society, the Ohio Protestant Episcopal Society for missionary purposes, the The-



logical Seminary of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the diocese of Ohio, the Missionary Society of Indiana, to be expended in this State, to be divided equally each share alike.

I give for the use and benefit of <sup>my sister</sup> Hannah Spooner five hundred dollars, the interest of which is to be paid her annually by my executors, I also give the like sum of five hundred dollars to my brother-in-law Frederick B. Leonard and to be disposed of as he deems fit

I Jacob Smith of Orange County and State of Indiana being afflicted and weak in Body but of a perfect mind and recollection and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die and being desirous to settle my worldly concerns do make publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament

and first it is my will and desire that my beloved wife Susannah Smith shall have and keep in her possession and subject to her control and disposal during her natural life or widowhood my tract of Land with all its Cents Issues and profits together with all my home hold and kitchen furniture and all my stock of cattle sheep and hogs with all my farming tools & horses Secondly I Will and bequeath to my son Ambrose my Blacksmith tools and at the death of my said wife or as soon as she shall be married to another man that my son Ambrose to have my said Land and to possess the same forever
