
Shabod Boswell's Will.

be sufficient pay all my debts, my will and desire is

that there should be enough of my other piece of lands sold, commencing on the South side, to pay them.

And my will and desire is that all the remaining balance of my property, both real and personally, be peaceable my beloved Wife, during her natural life, and after her decease to be sold and equally divided among my heirs, share and share alike. And I hereby make and ordain my worthy son Samuel Hodgday, Executor of this my last will and testament. 
