live, after which time, the same or the balance of, is to be sold and divided between my  
daughters Elizabeth Robbins and Catharine Walker, nevertheless if they can divide  
with on the sale of the property, they may do so with the exception of my large tract  
which I give to my son George Briner, also I bequeath to my wife Catharine Briner  
fifty dollars of my money that is due to me in Pennsylvania when the same is ob-  
tained: I next give to my son John Briner one dollar, and to my son Andrew Briner  
one dollar, to my daughter Mary Cook one dollar, and the balance of my money in  
Pennsylvania as follows, first to my son George Briner sixty dollars, and to my daughter  
Catharine Walker forty dollars, and to my son Peter Briner ten dollars and the balance  
to be divided equally, if any, between Peter Briner George Briner Elizabeth Robbins &  
Catharine Walker, and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Jacob Moulder  
executor to this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I the said Peter Briner  
Sen. have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above
