Shadrach B. A. Carter's Will.

Be it remembered that I Shadrach Blunt Anderson Carter of the County of Orange & State of Indiana being weak in body but of sound mind and memory & considering the uncertainty of this mortal life but in hope of a blessed Immortality & triumphant Resurrection through Jesus Christ do make & publish this my last will & testament in manner & form following (that is to say) First of my personal property or goods and chattles I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Carter one sorrel mare, one side saddle, first choice, one Briddle, first choice one yoke of Oxen yoke & logchain, one ox-cart fifteen head of sheep first choice, one cow first choice Ten hogs first choice two beds & the necessary furniture two bedsteads one large Carey Plough two pair of gears to include colass hains, traces, stretches swingle-tree &c. one chopping axe one wreding hoe, one grubbing hoe, one wheat-fan, & all the bacon, pork, wheat and flour of which I may die possessed, And it is my will that if any of the above property should remain at the death of my wife Margaret aforesaid that the avails thereof shall be equally divided among my children hereafter named & the residue & remainder of my personal property goods and chattles shall be sold as soon after my death as convenient or prudent, & my beloved wife, Margaret, as aforesaid shall have the third of the avails of the sale of such property & the residue shall be equally divided among my children, to wit: Elizabeth Kene Courtess late Elizabeth Kene Couder, formerly Elizabeth Kene Carter, Catharine Carpenter Carter, Maria Jane Carter, Shadrach Blunt Anderson Carter, Anna Liza Carter, Margaret Carter, Theophilus Dew Carter, John Couder Carter, Harriet Frances Carter & Henry Carpenter Carter, Secondly my real estate I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Carter for the term of twelve years. All my land in the County of Orange and State of Indiana being a part of the South

west quarter and a part of the North west quarter of section thirty-one township three north of range east in the district of Jeffersonville to have & to hold the same together with the hereditaments, appertinances, rents, issues & profits unto my beloved wife Margaret as aforesaid for the said term of twelve years if she should live that long & at the expiration of the said term of twelve years if my wife Margaret aforesaid should be living she shall have & retain her dower in & to the above named premises including the dwelling-house & all the other buildings on the farm to which after the period aforesaid she shall be restricted and which dower she shall retain during her natural life. It is my will that the above described land over & above my wife's dower shall not be divided or sold until after the death of my wife Margaret as aforesaid but after the expiration of said twelve years the profits if any arising from the aforesaid premises over & above the right of dower as aforesaid of my wife shall be equally divided among my children as above named. It is my will that at the death of my wife all the real estate above described in the County of Orange and State of Indiana as aforesaid with all its appertinances be sold & if deemed most expedient or advantageous by my executor hereinafter named on a credit of at least twelve months the purchaser giving Bond & good security & the proceeds arising therefrom shall be equally divided among all my children as above named. It is my will that my two tracts of Land adjoining each other in the county of Crawford & State of Illinois the number of which not being recollected be sold by my executrix & executor hereinafter named whenever they think proper & if most advantageous on a credit the purchaser giving bond & good security & that the avails thereof be equally divided among my children Elizabeth K. Vontres, Catharine C. Carter, Maria Jane Carter, Sarah B. A. Carter, Anna Liza Carter, Margaret Carter, Theophilus P. Carter, John Borden Carter, Harriet K. Carter, & Henry C. Carter. And it is my will that my wife shall keep the children together rearing & educate them as their natural guardian but I do not wish her to be compelled to do so out of her own funds. And I further give & bequeath to my wife one sythe & cradle, one mowing sythe & one reaping hook of first choice, one loom & its equipage. And I hereby appoint my beloved wife Margaret Carter executrix & Andrew Wilson executor of this my last will & testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this fifth day and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five.

Elizabeth Carr's Will.

In name of God Amen:

I Elizabeth Carr, of the County of Orange and state of
 Indiana being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind
 and memory - blest be the Almighty God for the same -
 do make & publish this my last will and testament in
 the manner and form following (that is to say:) First I
 give & bequeath to my sister Margaret Mitchell & her son
 Ina all the corn that is now growing on this farm, and
 all the oats. I do also give and bequeath to my Niece Emily
 Carr one of my beds and all the bed-clothing and bed-stead be-
 longing to the said bed. I also give & bequeath to my Nephew
 Elzy Mitchel ten dollars. I also give & bequeath to my Nephew
 David Campbell (son of Samuel Campbell) the colt that now suckes
 my mare. I do further give and bequeath to my Niece Emily Carr
 my tract of land which lies in Lawrence County - which lies
 between Jacob Huffstutter's & Isaac Walfacres' land land sup-
 posed to be eighty acres, be the same more or less, to her life-time;
 and after her death for my nephew Michael Lindsey to have
 one hundred dollars out of said land and if the land should
 be sold after Emily's death for the said Michael to have the
 first refusal of the same, and my sister Margaret to have fifty
 dollars out of said land after the said Emily's death. I also
 give & bequeath to my niece Mary Law, if alive after her
 sister Emily's death, fifty dollars out of the above named
 Orange of land. I also give & bequeath to my two nieces
