I now I first of all, give and bequeath my soul into the
hands of Almighty God our heavenly father in hope, of re-
ceiving it again at the day of the resurrection to be
restored to peace through our Lord Jesus Christ through
an endless eternity

I now I do give and bequeath unto my dear and loving
wife, Emily Clefton all my real and personal estate
as long as she remains my lawful widow or the youngest
child becomes of lawful age or marry, to assist her in the
raising of my youngest children. If any of my said children
should marry, and any reasonable recompense can be given
them by being charged with the same may be done at her dis-
cretion not by compulsion at the time of my youngest child
becoming of age or marry the remainder of my estate shall
be equally divided between my surviving heirs by sale or not
as the majority may agree. I do also appoint my father
in law, Calramon Reubison my lawful Executor with

First I do give and bequeath unto My son Lewis Jones all My right title and interest of fifty three and one third acres of land in the East half of the south West. q. of section (16) Town two North, Range one East to be laid off on the North End of said half quarter, by his paying up the annual payments for the same to the proper authority.

2nd I give unto My son Moses Jones all My right title and interest of fifty three and one third acres of land lying in the West half of the South East q. of section (16) Town two North of Range one East to be laid off on the North End of said half q. by his paying the annual instalments thereon to the proper person. 3rd I do give unto My son David Jones all My right title and interest to fifty three and one third acres of land lying on the south End of the two half q. above named by his paying up his proportion of the annual payments to the proper person. 4th I do give unto My son Moses Jones My Young sorrell Mare and one Cow and bed and furniture and two sheep and one breeding sow. 5th I do give and bequeath to My beloved wife Annelia Jones one cow and calf, feather bed and furniture and bedsteads one Chest and Cupboard and Table, her Saddle two Wheels and Reel for her use and benefit, and it is My Will that My wife have her Maintenance off of the land and farm where I now live during her Widowhood and it is My Will that all My Hogs sheep and Cattle and farming tools and all My household and Kitchen furniture and the aragon Mare be and remain on the farm for the use and support of My wife and My two youngest sons David and Samuel, I also give unto Elizabeth Woodard one dollar and to Nancy Busick one dollar
