Patrick Leasgrave's will

I Patrick Leasgrave of the French Lick Township in Orange county
of Indiana do make and publish this my last will and testament
hereby revoking and making void all my former wills by me at any
time heretofore made, first I direct that my body be decently interred and
that my funeral be conducted in a manner corresponding with my
estate and situation in life and as to such worldly estate as it
has pleased God to entrust me with I dispose of the same in the fol-
lowing manner to wit: I direct that forty acres of the north west
be sold at the end of the year 1849 my wife to have the benefit of
the present crop 1st I direct when the forty acres aforesaid is sold
that the debts due on the land be first paid 2nd my funeral expenses
3rd ad my just debts to be paid, and lastly if any remain that it equally
divided between my two sons John and James Leasgrave, I will all
my personal property with the south quarter or forty acres of the south
end of this eighty which I live on I will to my wife Charity Leasgrave
that she may dispose of it as she may think proper I also appoint
my loving wife to be my executrix of this will and testament in witness
whereof I, Patrick Leasgrave hereunto set my hand and seal this
fifteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and forty nine. Patrick Leasgrave Seal

Be it remembered that on this 14th day of August 1849 Alfred
Underwood personally appeared before me Jeremiah Wilson clerk of the
probate court of Orange county and being by me duly sworn saith that he saw
Patrick Leasgrave dead, the testator of the writing herein, sign his name thereto
by his proper mark, and declare and publish said writing to be his last
will and testament, and that said Patrick, at the time of the execution of
said will was of sound mind and memory, and not under coercion and
constraint, and that the said Alfred signed his name to said will as a
witness thereof at the request of said decedent in his presence, and in the
presence of Neaman Lane, another subscribing witness to said will, who
also signed his name to said will in the presence of said decedent and
in the presence of said Alfred Underwood. Alfred Underwood
