I Samuel Jones being very weak in body but sound in mind and calling to mind that it is appointed unto all men to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. First I do give and bequeath unto my son Lewis Jones all my right title and interest of fifty three and one third acres of land in the East half of the south West q. of section (16) Town two North Range one East to be laid off on the North End of said half quarter by his paying up the annual payment for the same to the proper authority. Samuel D.rd I do give unto my son Moses Jones all my right title and interest of fifty three and one third acres of land lying in the West half of the South East q. of section (16) Town two North of Range one East to be laid off on the North End of said half q. by his paying the annual instalments thereon to the proper persons. 3rd I do give unto my son David Jones all my right title and interest to fifty three and one third acres of land lying on the South End of the two half q.s. above named by his paying up his proportion of the annual payment to the proper person. 4th I do give unto my son Moses Jones my young sorrel mare and one cow and hea and furniture and two sheep and one breeding sow. 5th I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Amelia Jones one cow and calf, feather hea and furniture and bedsteads one chest and cupboard and Table, her Saddle two Wheats and Real for her use and benefit, and it is my Will that my wife have her Maintenance off of the land and farm where I now live during her widowhood and it is my Will that all my hogs sheep and cattle and farming tools and all my house hold and Kitchen furniture and the dog on Main because remain on the farm for the use and support of my wife and my two youngest sons David and Samuel, I also give unto Elizabeth Woodard one dollar and to Nancy Busick one dollar.

And to Lewis Jones one dollar, and Littleton Woodard and his wife shall have the same privilege of living in the house with my family as they have had heretofore until they can suit themselves better. I do also give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Jones the tract of land whereon I live containing 100 acres lying on the west side of the South East part of section seventeen of Town Two North of Range one East, and it is my will that my wife live on the farm in the house where we now live during her widowhood. I do also give Moses and David free privilege to raise tobacco grain stock and all kinds of produce on the farm where I now live to enable them to raise money to pay up for their land and also to my son Samuel the same privilege to raise produce on the farm to buy him a colt, and David the same, and to buy them saddles and such other things as they may need. It is also my will that all my pump boring tools, all my well diggin tools, and blowing tools and my rifle gun be sold to raise money to pay my just debts and annual expenses, and also I do appoint my well beloved friend Thomas Vandever to be my executor to see to my affairs and execute this my last will and testament, and do hereby declare the above instrument to be my last and only will.
