

Martha Lindleys will

I Martha Lindley of the County of Orange and State of Indiana, being of a sound mind and memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of time and the propriety of settling my Temporal affairs whilst in health, do make and ordain this my last will and testament revoking all others heretofore by me made

1st It is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid as soon after my decease as the situation of my affairs will permit

2nd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Guli Eliza Lindley the watch which was left me by her Father,

3rd It is my will that the residue of my Estate including all the monies that may be on hand or due me by bond or otherwise at my decease together with all the goods and chattels of every kind and description be divided into six equal parts, if the ~~get~~ legates agree so to do, but if in the opinion of my executors it would be best to sell the stock the goods and chattels, or any part thereof. It is my will that they dispose of such property, either at public or private sale as they may think would be most advantageous and the monies arising thereby be also divided into six equal parts one part I give and bequeath unto each of my children to wit: Heskiah Keenly, John Keenly, Joseph Keenly, Henry Keenly, Henry Braxton, Rebecca Keenly that is to each a sixth part of the above divided

4th It is my will that if any of the legates die or be dead before me without issue that their Legacy be equally divided amongst the surviving heirs

5th It is also my will and desire that if any of the Legates who have issue die before a dividend be made that their Legacy be equally divided amongst their children

And Lastly I constitute and appoint my sons Joseph and Henry Executors of this my last will and testament - In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of 11th mo. 1830.

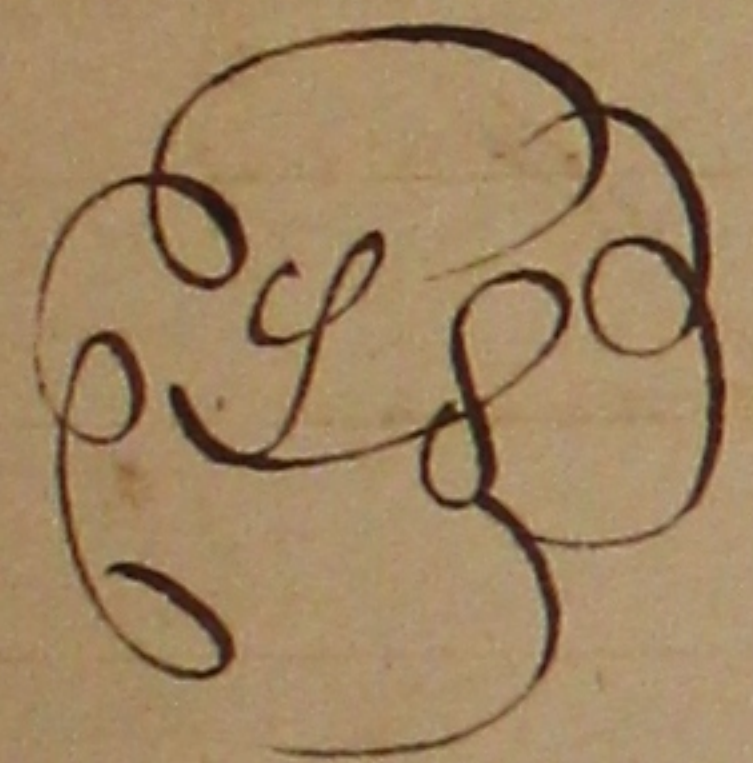
