

# Thomas Lindley's Will


In the Name of God Amen; Thomas Lindley of the  
County of Orange and State of Indiana, being of body but of  
perfect Mind and Memory Thanks be Given, unto God  
calling to Mind the Mortality of My Body - and Knowing  
that it was appointed for all Men once to die - I do make  
and Ordain this My Last will and Testament and such words  
I Give and demise and do dispose of the same in the follow-  
ing Manner - First that all My Just debts be paid and  
Funeral Expenses be paid in - I Will and bequeath unto  
My son Reuben Lindley one dollar - I bequeath unto My daughter  
Jane Green one dollar - I bequeath unto My daughter  
Sarah Andrew one dollar - I bequeath unto Mary Newlin  
one dollar - I Will and bequeath unto Hannah Cloud  
one dollar - I Will and bequeath unto My daughter Eleanor  
Lindley one dollar - I Will and bequeath unto My son Thomas  
Lindley sixty acres of Land that I now live on lying  
West lying on the East side of the North East quarter section  
Twenty Town One North of Range One East, the balance  
to be equally divided - I Ordain and appoint John  
Cloud My Sole Executor - I do hereby this will and Testament  
do hereby this will and Testament - will be just bequeath  
and execute by Me in anywise before mentioned - Whereof  
hereunto - Whereof I hereunto set My hand and seal this  
The Twenty third day of the Eleventh Month in the Year of our  
Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty five -



Lindley and that he caused them to sign his name thereto and  
and acknowledged the said will to be his last will and  
Testament - In Testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed

my name and affixed the seal of our said Court  
at Paoli this 15<sup>th</sup> day of December 1835
