

Record of Wills

Be it remembered that on the 9th day of August 1846 personally appeared before me Jeremiah Wilson clerk of the Probate Court of Orange County William Lindley who being of lawful age and duly affirmed deposes and says that he was acquainted with Joseph Farlow in his life time that the will annexed is the same will that he saw the said Joseph Farlow execute during his life time that he saw the said Joseph Farlow sign the said will and that he attested & subscribed the same in the presence of said testator - and that Joseph Melles was present at the signing & acknowledging of said will and also signed the said will in the presence of such testator that said Joseph Farlow was of full age to devise property and that he was of sound mind and memory and that the said Joseph Farlow did not make said will under coercion nor restraint as he verily believes and further saith not.
