all the farm and plantation wherean I now live  
except such part as will be hereafter otherwise  
disposed of to have and to hold the said premises  
to her own use and benefit until the youngest  
Child shall have arrived to the age of Twenty one  
Years or marriage I also bequeath all my farming  
tools and utensils of Every description all my House  
hold and kitchen furniture except such articles  
as will be hereafter devised I also give and bequeath  
unto her my mare known by the name of Blaze  
and her youngest calf Five Cows and Ten Sheep  
her chaise all my stack of Wags also all the  
Corn Bacon and grain and provender of every  
kind that may be on hand or in the ground at  
my decease

4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas the  
sum of fifty cents

5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son Iron the sum  
of fifty cents

6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah W  
Vey the sum of fifty cents

7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha  
Thomson the sum of fifty cents

8<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Polly  
Hollawell the sum of fifty cents

9<sup>th</sup> I give unto my Daughter Susan Amy the sum  
of fifty cents

10<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth  
one Bed and bedding which she no claims

11<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ellen  
one Bed and bedding

12<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Grace  
one Bed and bedding that her mother may think to  
give her



13<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my three sons  
 David Green and Chambers Two thirds of the  
 Land which I now live on and not otherwise except  
 when the youngest shall have arrived at ~~some~~  
 the age of Twenty one or Marriage and the other  
 third at the death or marriage of their Mother to  
 be to be sold otherwise equally divided as they may  
 think best amongst them selves

14<sup>th</sup> It is my will that my Executors sell Fifty Acres  
 of land off the North end of the place where I now  
 live either at Public or Private Sale which they  
 may think best Also all the residue of the property  
 which is not herein bequeathed and the balance which  
 may remain after paying the debts and other incident  
 tax charges that it be Equally divided between  
 my four Daughters Susan Amy Elizabeth Eleanor  
 and Grace and my three sons David Green &  
 Chambers that is one seventh Part to each of them  
 Lastly I constitute and appoint my son in law  
 Brock Chapman and my son John Executors  
 of this my last Will and Testament  
 Signed and sealed this 2<sup>d</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month  
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight  
 hundred and twenty eight
