just debts I then give and bequeath all my lands
and tenements goods, chattels, rights, credits, moneys
and effects, to be equally divided between my four chil-
dren, in equal proportions, viz. Simon M. Cornwall, Nancy
Cornwall, William M. Cornwall, and Elizabeth Cornwall
and in order that the above will may be carried into
effect and executed, according to law, I appoint my
two sons, Simon M. and William M. Cornwall, to be ex-
ecutors of the same. Given under my hand and seal
this 26th day of September 1842.

make and publish this my last will. ~~do make and pub-~~
lish this my and testament hereby revoking and mak-
ing void all former wills by me, at any time, heretofore
made. First, I direct that my body be decently interred
and that my funeral be conducted in a manner cor-
responding with my estate and situation in life, and
as to such worldly estate as it has pleased God to im-
trust me with I dispose of them in the following man-
ner, to wit. I direct first, that all my just debts and fu-
neral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as pos-
sible, out of my personal property, the balance of my
personal property, together with all my real estate
household and kitchen furniture shall be and remain
the absolute property of my wife, as long as she remain

my widow, if she shall be married to an other man, then I direct that all the real estate, together with the personal property shall be sold, by my executor, and equally divided between my then living children. But the household and kitchen furniture, to be and remain the absolute property of my wife. And to effect this my intention I hereby make and ordain my worthy and esteemed friend John Mollowne, Executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I John Self, the testator have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifteenth of August, in the year of the Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three.

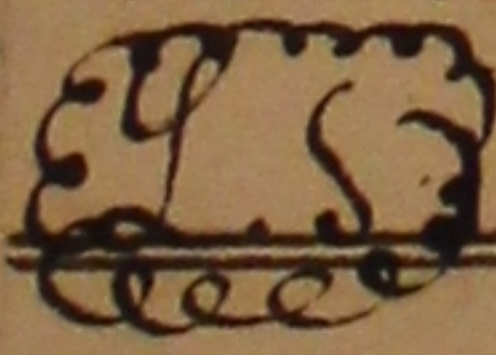

Thomas Atkinson's Will.

I Thomas Atkinson, of the County of Orange, and State of Indiana, being of perfect mind and sound memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of time, do make and ordain this, my last will and testament, this second day of the eleventh month, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and forty, revoking all others heretofore, by me made.

Item 1st It is my will that the plantation whereon I now live be equally divided between my four sons, namely John, Robert, Arthur and Henry and if they cannot agree in the division thereof themselves, it is my will that they refer it to two disinterested men, and if they cannot agree, those two shall choose a third, whose judgment in the division shall be final.
