

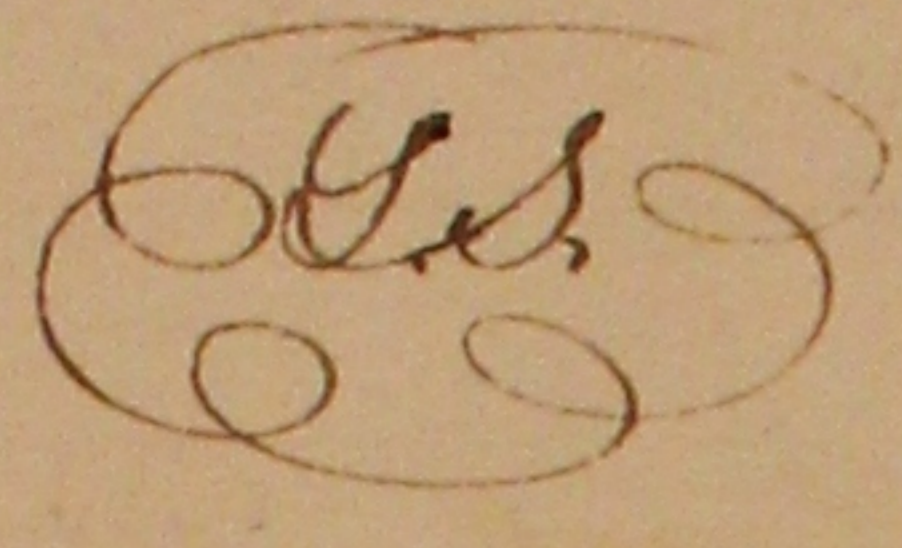

## John Throop Will

I John Throop of Orange County Indiana do make and  
publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and  
making void all others wills by me at any time heretofore made

First. I direct that my body be decently interred and my funeral  
be conducted in a manner corresponding with my estate and situation  
in life. as to such worldly estate as it has pleased God to entrust  
me with I dispose of the same in the following manner to wit,

first I direct that all my last debts and funeral expence be  
be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of the first money  
that shall come into the hands of my executor from any <sup>portion</sup> of my estate  
real or personal. I also direct that all my estate both real and person-  
al, including my property of any and every discription be by my  
executor sold at public auction or at private sale for cash or on cre-  
dit as to him may seem most proper and profitable to those concerned  
and in such manner as may be usual in like cases and to effectuate  
this my intention I hereby vest my executor with full power and  
authovity to dispose of my real estate in fee simple or for a term  
of years or otherwise in as full and ample a manner in every respect  
as I could myself do if living. I also direct that out of the  
avails of my estate thus disposed of one hundred dollars be  
paid by my executor to John S. Moore & one hundred dollars  
to Rebecca Lane Moore the one the son the other the daughter of my  
daughter Lane Moore - that in like manner fifty dollars be paid  
to Martha Lefler (my adopted grand daughter) also I direct that  
two dollars be paid to my son Oliver M. Throop, (I having paid  
him a child's full share previous to this time) and further that the  
residue of said avails be equally divided share and share alike among-  
st my other children to wit Lane Moore, Sophia C. Throop, John J. Throop,  
Ann R. Wood and Susanna Wolf.

And I hereby make and ordain my son John J. Throop  
sole executor of this my last will and Testament

hand and seal this December twenty eighth in the year of our Lord one

2<sup>nd</sup> I will to the above named William and Samuel my sheep and hogs and Farming utensils and all my shop tools of every description my last debts if any to be paid out of the above property

3<sup>rd</sup> It is my will that Eliza Scott shall have the house she now lives in to enjoy as her own as long she lives a widow she is to have the liberty of the kitchen Orchard Barn crib and Stables during the same time she is not to transfer none of the above to any other person

4<sup>th</sup> I make a reserve of one fourth of an acre of land where the grave yard now is for a burying place for the family. this is never to be transferred out of the family

5<sup>th</sup> I will to Martha Lane McWheters and her born heirs at the death of her Mother all the house hold and kitchen furniture and all my
