

I Jesse Lowell of the County of Orange and State of Indiana, being of a sound mind and perfect memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of time do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, revoking all others heretofore made by me this 18th day of the 5th fifth month in the year of our of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine. ~~Item~~ Item 1st It is my will that so much of my property as may be sufficient to pay all my last debts and funeral expenses be sold my wife shall have the exclusive privilege of selecting the property for sale: 2nd I give and bequeath to my ^{beloved} wife Elizabeth the residue of my property of every description consisting of house hold and kitchen furniture, the crops now growing, horse, Cattle, Sheep, and hogs, farming utensils &c. in short every species of property of which I may be possessed. Lastly I constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth Executrix of this my last will and Testament, signed sealed and acknowledged the day date above written Jesse H. Lowell  Test.

Be it remembered that on this 7th day of August 1849 John Dixon (son of Simon) personally appeared before me Jeremiah Milson Clerk of the Probate Court of Orange County, and being by me duly affirmed upon affirmation saith that he saw Jesse H.
