

John Williams Will

Know all men by these presents I John Williams of the County of
Orange and State of Indiana, being of sound mind and disposing
memory, and impressed with uncertainty of duration of human life
do make publish and declare my last will and testament in
manner and form following viz. 1st I will and bequeath unto
my sons Isaac and Robert Williams jointly and to their heirs
and assigns forever the following tract of land, viz: The south
west quarter of section fourteen (14) in Township one North of
Range one west, and its appurtenances to be equally divided
between them, which they may do by agreement or otherwise
according to law; 2nd I will and bequeath to the said Isaac
Williams and to his heirs and assigns forever the East half

of the south east quarter of section fifteen (15) in Township one North of Range one west. 3rd I will and bequeath to my son John Williams and to his heirs and assigns forever the following tracts of land and their appurtenances viz: the west half of the south east quarter of section fifteen (15) and the east half of the south west quarter of section fifteen (15) both in Township one North of Range one west, and I also bequeath to the said John Williams my Clock; 4th I also will and direct that the bequests of the several tracts of land aforesaid shall be subject to the following condition - "The said Louisa Robert and John shall be charged with the maintenance sustenance and support of their mother Rachel Williams in case she survives me and as long as she may live to contribute thereto equally and in such manner as that she shall not want anything to make her comfortable;" 5th I will and bequeath unto my grand son William Bloomer Carter and to his heirs and assigns forever the following tract of land and the appurtenances viz: The west half of the south west quarter of section fifteen in Township one North of Range one west 6th I will and direct that after the payment of my last debts and the expenses of executing this will and of my last sickness that the residue of my personal estate be equally divided amongst my several children or their legal heirs share and share alike. I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made. And appoint my friend Jonathan Farlow Executor of this my last will and testament. 
