 furniture and all the sheep and a but Recd
 all the tithing sheaves And my will is that at the
 death of my wife Mary Wilson the above tract
 of Land with all and singular the appertinances
 there unto belonging I Give and devise and bequeath
 the same unto my beloved son Joseph Wilson his
 heirs and assigns to have and hold the same with
 all and singular the appertinances there unto belonging
 for ever the above mentioned personal property at
 the death of my beloved Wife shall be sold at public
 vendue and the amount arising therefrom shall
 be equally divided amongst all my beloved Children
 to wit Namely Beloved Daughters Margaret Fields and
 Sarah Andrew Wilson and Rachel Fields and Nathaniel
 Wilson and Joseph Wilson My Will is further that
 my Beloved son Joseph Wilson Recive of Samuel
 Chambers one hundred and Ten dollars which sum
 the said Chambers is now due me and the said
 sum when Received shall be to discharge a debt
 that I owe to Thomas Evans My Will is that the Best
 half of the South east Quarter of Section Four in
 Town Two North of Range one West of the Lands
 sold at Vincennes shall be sold at public sale
 for the best price that can be had immediately after
 my death and the amount of the said sale shall
 be equally divided between my beloved sons Andrew
 Wilson and Nathaniel Wilson
