John N. Kinman, 87, Passes After A Long And Useful Life.— Funeral Held Petersburg.

John N. Kinman, for many years a well known citizen of Pike county, the greater part of his long and useful life being lived in the Brenton Chapel community, died Saturday evening in an Evansville hospital, his death coming at 6:00 o'clock.

He was a son of Henry and Eliza Jane Hayes Kinman. He was born in the Brenton Chapel community April 20, 1859 and had reached the advanced age of 87 years, 8 months and 28 days. He married Hattie E. Anderson March 25, 1880 and they lived together until her death, October 11, 1907. Surviving are four of the ten children born to them, Mrs. Maude E. Kinman, wife of Frank Kinman of Petersburg; Morley Kinman of Jasper; Edison Kinman of Rifle, Colorado; Mrs. Ethel Harvey, San Diego, California; three grandchildren and a sister Alice Kinman of Algiers.

From early life Mr. Kinman had been a member of the General Baptist church, for the latter part of his life a member of the Pleasant Ridge class. He had lived a good life and through his kindness, charity and always ready to help others, he had gathered a wide circle of admiring friends. The funeral service was held Tuesday afternoon at the First Baptist church in Petersburg with Rev. Grover C. Krieg in charge of the service. The body was taken to the McClure cemetery near Algiers for burial.
