Since Mr. and Mrs. E. K. Van Winkle and family came to Spartanburg in February, Mrs. Van Winkle has succeeded in organizing a splendid adult class of young women. She found a number of young ladies eager to do more definite work in the Bible School, and, upon proposing to them to organize according to the requirements of the adult-class movement, she found them willing to do so. The following officers were chosen: Bertha Bowen, President; Ida Nuss, Vice-President; Winefred Martin, Secretary; Garnet Wiggs, Treasurer. Committees were appointed and a vigorous campaign for members was begun, which resulted in an enrollment of twenty-eight. This organization has put new life not only into the class, but into the whole school. The rivalry between it and the men's class has been interesting. The motto of this class is, "Each One Win One and Every Member a Christian". The young ladies have taken an active part in raising funds to paper the church. They have demonstrated the value of organized work, and the younger classes have caught the inspiration to organize and do work on a grander scale. The class is now considering the support of an orphan girl. We trust that this and many other enterprises may mark its future.
