The new year is ushering in some great news. Genealogists were already anticipating 2012, with the release of the 1940 census in April. The National Archives had already committed to putting digital images of the 1940 census online for free, thanks to an agreement with Archives.com. Now comes word that there will be a free index, too.

Genealogy entities Archives.com, FamilySearch and findmypast.com recently announced they will collaborate on a project to create a free online index. Volunteers are needed to help with this massive undertaking (there were approximately 130 million people in 1940) - visit the project site, www.the1940census.com, for more information and to practice your indexing skills in preparation for April. Update: Social Security Changes

In our last e-mail, we told you about policy changes by the Social Security Administration concerning Social Security records and how that would affect researchers. The fallout from those policy changes continues. The Social Security Death Index (SSDI) that has been a staple of Rootsweb has now been taken down by Rootsweb's parent, Ancestry.com, with a [note](#) mentioning "sensitivities" as the reason for its removal.

It should be noted that the index is still available for searching on Ancestry.com. Cyndi's List has a [listing](#) of all the sites that still offer free access to the SSDI.

Hendricks County Probate Records Project

We've added more [digital files](#) - there are now 505 files online.

We've added to our [database of the dates of death](#) mentioned in the estate cases - there are now 620 entries in it.

A note if you plan to visit Hendricks County to do research: the Hendricks County courthouse has just added some security measures. You must now enter and exit through the doors on the west side of the building (Jefferson Street), and pass through a metal detector.

Indiana Marriage Indexing Project

Our [Indiana Marriage Indexing Project \(1811-1959\)](#), done in partnership with FamilySearch, continues to progress. Entries from Hamilton County, Hendricks County and Jay County have been added, bringing the number of Indiana

counties included in the index to 35. FamilySearch estimates that the project is 53% complete.

Indexers are currently working on records from Jefferson County, Jennings County, LaGrange County and Lawrence County. Your help is welcome - just sign up with [FamilySearch Indexing](#), go to their Partner Projects page and download a batch from our project.
