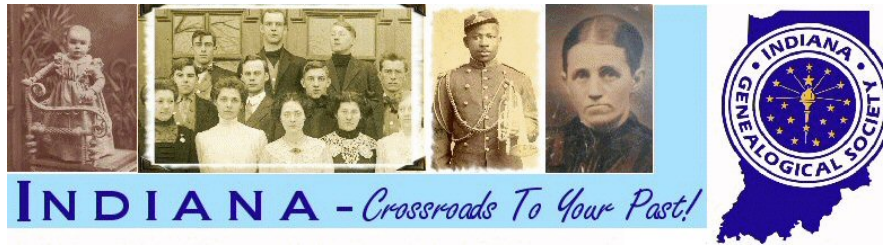

FOUND: Photo of South Bend man (1880's)

Shelley Cardiel (cardiels@comcast.net) has found this photo, identified as being John GRUBER, which was taken at the McDonald Studio in South Bend,

Indiana. The photograph appears to have been taken in the 1880's or 1890's, with John likely in his 50's at the time. In addition to his name, on the back of the photograph someone has also written "Emma's Father" and Callie Polson's Uncle".

Research has found that John Gruber was born about 1828 in Bavaria and died between 1880 and 1900. He was a shoemaker and married Margaret (born August 1832 in Bavaria). They lived in South Bend and had 9 children: Charles, Lena (born August 1858), George, Louise (born about 1860), Sophia (born March 1862), Kate, Mary, Edward (born April 1868) and Emma (born March 1870; married James Bertram REASOR who was born in 1876 and died in 1946).

County Roundup

Here are some genealogy and history-related news items from around the state. NOTE: Items on other websites often change or are removed without notice - we apologize if you encounter a link that no longer works.

ALLEN COUNTY

--A contractor doing utility work in Fort Wayne recently [uncovered](#) human remains. The remains were discovered while digging on West Washington Boulevard. Per state law, the site will be marked as a burial site and protected.

--The Allen County Genealogical Society of Indiana has added several free databases to the Records section of their [website](#), including divorce case files from the 1840's through the 1870's and plat maps of landowners from the 1940's and 1950's.

FAYETTE COUNTY

The Indiana Landmarks Foundation has [rescued](#) the Newkirk Mansion in Connersville, which was on its most endangered list for 2017. The mansion was built in 1880 and the foundation has turned it over to a couple who will be restoring and preserving it.

HENRY COUNTY

The [Henry County Cemetery Commission](#) has [received funding](#) from the county to erect signs marking 37 pioneer cemeteries.

JASPER COUNTY

Details about the military veterans buried in Jasper County cemeteries have been compiled into a database, [JC Veterans Cemetery List](#), which is available for free on Internet Archive, as part of the Jasper County Public Library's [collection](#). This database, which includes photos of tombstones, was [compiled](#) by Kyle Eenigenburg for his Eagle Scout Project.

JENNINGS COUNTY

The family of Annabelle Pickett recently [donated](#) her extensive collection to the Jennings County Public Library in North Vernon. The collection includes old photos of area churches and schools, as well as family documents dating back to the 1700's.

LAKE COUNTY

The graves of 94 infants buried in St. John/St. Joseph Cemetery in Hammond from 1936 through 1958 were recently cleaned, repaired and restored. The [restoration](#) was for Nicholas Wilson's Eagle Scout Project.

LAPORTE COUNTY

The former site of LaPorte University will [receive](#) a state historical marker in early 2018, thanks to the research efforts by local officials. LaPorte University only existed in the town of LaPorte during the 1840's, but it included the state's first medical college. The buildings were destroyed by fire in 1856.

MONROE COUNTY

An [article](#) explores the history of Dunn Cemetery, which is on the campus of Indiana University in Bloomington. It is a family cemetery created in the 1800's for 3 Brewster sisters, and you must prove you are a direct descendant in order to be buried there.

ST. JOSEPH COUNTY

South Bend recently held a ceremony to honor resident Alexander L. Arch, who was credited with firing the first shot by an American in World War I. An [article](#) about his descendants details how they continued his tradition of military service. Arch (1894-1979) emigrated from Hungary and started working in a factory in South Bend when he was 12.

TIPPECANOE COUNTY

Workers renovating the dome of the Tippecanoe County courthouse recently [discovered](#) paychecks from the 1800's hidden inside it. Hiding paychecks was believed to bring prosperity.

New IGS databases - 9 for 92 status reached

We now have **2,062** total databases for members. We also have reached "9 for 92" status - we have at least 9 databases for each of Indiana's 92 counties.

Here are all the premium databases (accessible only to IGS members) that we've added recently:

College Records

- Evansville College - directory of students (1940); directory of faculty (1940). NOTE: Evansville College later changed its name to University of Evansville.
- Indiana University, Bloomington - graduates (1917).
- Tri-State College, Angola - graduates (1942). NOTE: Tri-State College later changed its name to Trine University.

County Records

- Clinton County - students in Kirklin schools grades 1-12 (1929); teachers at Kirklin High School (1929).
- Jay County - Portland High School students and teachers (1937).
- Marshall County - Brick School students (1908). NOTE: Brick School was District No.12 in West Township.
- Monroe County - African-Americans in 1850-1870 censuses.
- Newton County - county history (1933); histories of Brook and Morocco (1916).
- Porter County - Valparaiso High School students (1909) - grade 12 only.
- Steuben County - Indiana Legion rosters: Steuben Rangers (1863); Turkey Creek Rangers (1863).
- Switzerland County - phone directory for Patriot (1956).

Legal terms explained: Life estate

If you've looked at deeds, or at wills, you may have seen where someone was granted a "life estate" to a house or piece of land. A life estate is where the ownership of that piece of property only lasts as long as that person is alive - when they die, the ownership of that property will revert to someone else.



For example, a man's will may grant his widow a life estate to their house, and then after her death, the will states that the ownership of the house is to go to their surviving children.

When looking at these details, make note of the item's Location Code and the Barcode (if available). This information is what you will need to provide to the Indiana State Archives' staff so that they can retrieve it for you when you visit.

SEARCH FOR SERIES:

As we saw in the container search, an item may also be part of a larger collection of items. If you are interested in viewing these larger collections, you would use the Series search. In our Container search, one of the microfilm results said it was part of a series, "Hospital, Casualty and Cemetery Records." If we search for this series, we can see everything that is included in that designation, which includes an 1862-1864 book on hospitalized soldiers as well as the microfilm:

If you are interested in finding all the items from a particular government office or institution, you would use the Entities search. In this example, we searched for public instruction, since we knew the state's Superintendent for Public Instruction is the one who deals with schools:
